"Armored Saint: In the Middle Voice"

Ephesians 6:18

Ephesians 6:10-18 stresses the importance of being equipped for spiritual warfare, and prayer is a common thread that runs throughout any/every spiritual conflict. Prayer is a connection to the almighty God; one that no one can sever, but one that is, sadly, often neglected. There may be many reasons for that, but the bottom line is this: if you find it difficult to pray, maybe you have more to learn about who God is. He is a friend that sticks closer than a brother; a friend who longs to hear from you, longs to help you, longs to love you. Let's see what Ephesians 6:18 has to tell us.

Suggestions on keeping the 'prayer lines' open

Pray without delay

- "At all times" means at every suitable or fitting time or occasion
 - How to "stock your prayer pantry"
 - Keep in <u>practice</u>
 - Make prayer a conversation between you and God
 - Memorize and pray Scripture
 - Look for the <u>answers</u>

Pray with a spiritual perspective

- The statement in Eph. 6 is not a condemnation of anyone who does not pray in tongues. There is nothing wrong with praying in tongues that's just not what this verse is about
- Asking for God's will to be done can be done either with <u>reverence</u> or with <u>resignation</u>
- God is very capable of accomplishing His will without you, but He invites you to cooperate with Him in doing so

Pray in every way you can

- Prayer is your direct line to "mission central"
 - Prayer is all forms of communication between you and God
 - There are many forms of prayer silently or aloud; through expressions of worship and praise; alone or with a crowd.

3 B's of prayer (Eph. 6:18)

Be watchful

- "Keep alert"
 - Pray with a high level of expectation

Be persistent

- "Keep alert with all perseverance"
 - When you're pushing a rock uphill, you don't quit until the job is done!

Be <u>ready</u>

- "Praying at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication"
 - "Praying" is written in what we would call the *middle* voice
 - Pray with the expectation that God will answer, and with the understanding that He may use you as part of that answer.

- 8. What have you learned through your personal time of Bible reading this week?
